

Artist Teri Atkins Brown

We welcome Teri Atkins Brown, our first featured demo artist for 2017, on January 31st at 7 p.m.

Growing up in the Cherokee National Forest, Teri Atkins Brown now splits her time between the Rocky and Smoky Mountains. As a painter and photographer she has won over 120 awards for her artworks and has been accepted into over 250 juried shows. With her first programming degree at 18, she graduated at the top of her interior architecture & design program at University of Tennessee. Previously working for a top interior design firm, a New York Times-owned paper, designing TV sets for a Washington Post owned cable station and as a graphic designer for several Midwest newspapers, she now serves as President of the Colorado Springs Art Guild.

Teri was a member of the Jackson Art Association, Tenn. Watercolor Society, Southern Watercolor Society and now PPWS, a member or leader in 16 art & photo groups in total. She created a rural art group in Tennessee which had gained 150 members in its first year. She was nominated for the Tennessee Governor's Award for Arts Leadership through her activity and passion for the arts in Western continued on page 2

Buffalo Kaplinski

Buffalo is considered a master watercolorist by many. His color choices have been in question by many. This however has not deterred his direction. He studied with the famed master, Irving Shapiro in Chicago at the American Academy of Art, an art school noted for turning out great illustrators. Shapiro was an American Watercolor Society member and had a conservative color palette, he did not like the "Buffalo Colors". Shapiro taught the use of the #8 red sable brush and was an excellent teacher in his approach to watercolors.

Kaplinski was infected with the Plein Air Virus & continues today with that challenge. He continues to work in his favorite states: Colorado, Utah and Arizona with focused plein air locations of Canyonlands, Arches, Canyon de Chelly, Zion, and Mesa Verde. "Being able to live and paint in Colorado is a great blessing. The Lord put me here."

Dan has spent over 40 years as an entrepreneur in publishing, launching several publishing companies and turning around others. He started out launching NavPress, a book and magazine house for The Navigators, launching a book publisher, WaterBrook Press for Random House and a turnaround for David C Cook book and curriculum publisher.

Early on, Dan found that publishing allowed him to utilize his creative skills in packaging, branding and marketing. This creative strength set his companies apart from the competition. They collected numerous national and regional awards for graphics, art, creative packaging and advertising excellence. Many of the books he published stayed perpetually on the best sellers lists, including the New York Times for years.

Dan retired in 2015 and became a full-time artist. His current focus is on soft pastels and exploring all subject matter. Featuring both studio and plein air works while seeing how his pastels influence his work in acrylic and oils.


